The general equation to me should be:

Hosting ads = \$x.xx per click or impression = profit

I don't see where spending on impressions is necessary in that very simple equation. So why this spending money to "qualify anything"? That idea in itself is totally separate than conventional ad hosting. Or if you have to qualify panels get you impressions, that means you pay for impressions on the ads you host, and that means that this business model doesn't require any real, genuine, organic traffic thru the ads, but only artificial traffic paid for by the affiliates themselves.

It's great to hear that some people have gotten conversions thru advertising with BB, and that indicates organic traffic, but the majority of what I see online is people going back and forth about how to invest their money (let's not do the "investment" argument please) and spending money to get impressions to qualify their panels... Then it seems that a majority of the impressions are actually not real and just paid for by the affiliates...and that points to internal consumption...
